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TO THE READERS

Responsibility for a wise discernment of the lights and shadows in humanity and in history...

I find this line in the Constitutions in the chapter "Our Style of Life" and gladly open this bulletin by letting the compass orient me toward discernment, toward our destination.

That discernment is requiring something of us and involving us as Companies and as a federated institute in this precise historical moment.



We have a responsibility...

The responsibility is a serious commitment; it does not allow us to go forward superficially; it no longer permits us to postpone certain choices, because now it is our task, the task of each Company and of the Federation.

It is a responsibility about charism, formation, and accompaniment.

It is a responsibility about governance, properties, the future of each Group and each Company.



It is a responsibility that invites us to come together, to face things, to take stock of ourselves, to look it in the face, to calculate our energies, and to **review today our programs for tomorrow... it is urgent!** Saint Angela requires it!

We must confer together and make a careful examination of the government. It falls to us to provide for everything as the Holy Spirit will inspire us (cf. Legacies 8 and 10)

Wise discernment...

What is asked of us is not some sort of vague discernment that is not acted on, that does not open up a process and leaves things as they are.... What is asked of us is wisdom. But wisdom is a gift of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is always at work in us and Saint Angela calls for a special obedience to the Holy Spirit: And above all to obey the counsels and the inspirations that the Holy Spirit continually raises up in the heart.

We will be able to ask ourselves whether we are capable of discernment and, still more, whether we are making a *wise discernment*.

At times we wait for the situations to resolve themselves on their own, other times we put them off (for whom? till when?), or we close our eyes to today and tomorrow.

But how and when does the Holy Spirit operate? We will hear the Spirit's voice all the more clearly the more purified and cleansed our conscience (cf. Rule Chapter 8:14-15).

Glimpsing the lights and shadows... discerning the plan of God for history and orienting daily events in the light of things above... (Constitutions 3.4).

The shadows, as Saint Angela warns us in the Prologue to her Rule, are the shadows of evil, of sin, *snares and dangers*... because there is no type of evil that is not here to be resisted...

The light is grace, it is goodness, it is the Lord in our midst.

Now too, light is attained with obedience: "Obedience is in [us] like *a great light,* which makes every work good and acceptable.... everything of ours, if it is supposed to be good, should be done in obedience" (Rule, Ch. 8:4-6).

Light is attained with a wise discernment done individually and together. Light is attained by obeying God, the Church, and the Constitutions of our institute: "In evaluation within the Company each of us will learn to discern according to her own life situations, the demands of obedience, "great light" and source of freedom and joy..." (Constitutions 19.3).

Discernment is done in order to be able to *please Jesus Christ our* Spouse as much as possible (Legacy 4:3).

Discernment is done according as charity and the Holy Spirit will enlighten and inspire you, directing everything toward good... (Legacy 9:7-8)

Let us pray with Saint Angela for wise discernment: "My Lord, light up the darkness of my heart.... Keep my affections and my senses safe so that they may not lead me astray, neither to the right nor to the left, nor turn me away from your brilliant

face..." (Rule Ch. 5:16-19).

If we make a wise discernment personally and as a Company...

thorny and rocky roads we will find flower-strewn for us, paved with finest gold.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERATION



The Courage for Personal Discernment and for Discernment in the Company

Dear ones,

"Jesus invites us to return to the sources of joy, which are encounter with him, the courageous choice to take the risk of following him, and the enthusiasm to leave something to embrace his way. The saints have walked this journey" (Pope Francis). Saint Angela did it.

What do we do? Where do we go? Where will we drink to

nourish our hearts with joy and make it shine through?

Do we settle down in the monotony of a Christian life without enthusiasm, thus remaining incomplete and resigned, or do we want to launch daily into Love?

Together let us try to launch into Love.

To do this, let us look to Saint Angela and try to act as she did. Let us take our place at the foot of the Cross, let us embrace the Crucified, let us make *most fervent prayers*, let us pause over that Word "happy" which the Gospel brings and listen with a purified and free heart to each suggestion and each stimulus.

"Happy" are you poor, meek, merciful, peacemaking, pure, persecuted

Happy: This is our call. Together with the whole Church, we are called to happiness, to put ourselves on God's side. This protects us from the dangerous deceit of egoism and opens us to the logic of love.

Before God, all of us are poor, afflicted, but if we go to him in trust, the Lord will have a word of consolation for each of us.

With the Holy Spirit's help, this word "Happy are you..." will give us new vigor for newness of life, for wearing inside and out that joy that gives flavor and zest to our living. We are happy and we demonstrate joy whenever we distance ourselves a little from our possessions, whenever we are able to share them with sisters or brothers near and far, whenever we do something out of love for God, whenever our intentions and our actions are guided by an upright heart.

What enriches us, satisfies us, and gives us joy and dignity is Love; it is the Lord, our Lover. Jesus Christ is our only Treasure. He alone is able to give the gift of Life. He is the Life. He is the Way. He is the Truth.

Today the Church asks the Companies united in the Federation to respond to our specific vocation with courageous choices so that the charism of Saint Angela may not diminish in the Church. This requires from us a new leap of faith. It requires us to live the present with passion and to embrace the future with hope, not only to look upon the past with gratitude.

Simply and sincerely we read the situations and the choices facing us personally and as a Company. We ask ourselves: what would Saint Angela do here and now? Are our choices consistent with the Saint Angela's original project?

The courage for personal discernment and for discernment in the Company is urgent, so that our life may become meaningful for the Church and the world. If our witness is not a Gospel witness with the traits of the Risen One, it will be dead, dry, destined to fade away.

Then let us encourage each other with all good will not to neglect personal and communal formation. Let us help each other care for and nourish sisterhood and prayer, an *indisputable sign of the Lord's presence in our midst*.

Let us reinvigorate the roots of our vocation, as Saint Angela recommends to us: "Act, move, believe, strive, hope, cry out to God with all your heart, and without doubt you will see marvels" (Prologue to the Counsels 17-18).

This was the road she walked, this is the road that she points out to us to fulfill the project of our own holiness. **With the Rule and the** **Constitutions in our hearts and in our hands,** let us live faithfully the road of holiness she has pointed out to us. "Holiness is boldness, it is a Gospel impulse that leaves a mark on this world. So that this may be possible, Jesus comes to meet us and says once again, serenely and firmly, Do not be afraid" (Pope Francis).

Saint Angela reassures us: "Hold this for certain: that this Company was planted directly by his holy hand and he will not abandon this Company as long as the world endures" (Last Legacy 6-7).

Let us make very fervent prayers because we need the Holy Spirit's push in order not to be paralyzed by fear and by calculations, so as not to hide and shelter ourselves within secure boundaries. The Church and the world need our fidelity to the vocation.

At our ordinary Assembly of 2018, Vatican Secretary of State Cardinal Parolin addressed us, reminding us to respond with fidelity and joy to this call: the call to **holiness**, to **console** and to give others **dignity**, to **renew** and to bear **light** in the world and in history.

This is our call, this is our happiness. "United together," let us respond with passion and enthusiasm, always clinging to the word of our Mother, sister, and faithful friend:

"Be bound to one another by the bond of charity, esteeming each other, helping each other, bearing with each other in Jesus Christ. For if you strive to be like this, without any doubt, the Lord God will be in your midst.... Because God has so ordained from all eternity, that those who for his honour are united in doing good enjoy every prosperity, and that what they do turns out well, because they have God himself and every one of his creatures in their favour. See then how important is this union and concord. So, long for it, pursue it, embrace it, hold on to it with all your strength; for I tell you, living all together thus united in heart, you will be like a mighty fortress, or a tower impregnable against all adversities, and persecutions, and deceits of the devil. And moreover I assure you that every grace you ask from God will infallibly be granted to you. And I shall always be in your midst, helping your prayers.... And at the same time rejoice, because, without doubt, what I say to you will be so.... be consoled, and have a lively faith and hope" (Ninth Counsel).

"*Test everything, retain what is good*" (1 Thessalonians 5:21) Discernment is necessary; it is a grace...

It is necessary... when some novelty presents itself in our lives. Then we have to decide whether it is a new wine brought by God or an illusion created by the devil.

...When the forces of evil induce us not to change, to leave things as they are, to opt for a rigid resistance to change ... that would be to block the working of the Spirit.

Discernment is necessary not only at extraordinary times, when we need to resolve grave problems, and make crucial decisions.

We need it at all times: to help us recognize God's timetable, lest we fail to heed the promptings of his grace and disregard his invitation to grow.

It involves striving untrammeled for all that is great, better, and more beautiful...

Discernment also enables us to recognize the **concrete means** that the Lord provides in his mysterious and loving plan, to make us move beyond mere good intentions.

We should always remember that discernment is a grace.

Even though it includes reason and prudence, it goes beyond them, for it seeks a glimpse of that unique and mysterious plan that God has for each of us, which takes shape amid so many varied situations and limitations.

Ultimately, discernment leads to the wellspring of undying life: to know the Father, the only true God, and the one whom he has sent, Jesus Christ (cf. John 17:3).

It requires no special abilities, nor is it only for the more intelligent or better educated. The Father readily reveals himself to the lowly (cf. Matthew 11:25).

(Pope Francis, Rejoice and Be Glad, 168,169,170)

Discernment Let us ask ourselves Pope Francis's questions:



- Do I know myself, quite apart from my illusions and emotions?
 - Do I know what brings joy and

sorrow to my heart?

- ▶ What are my strengths and weaknesses?
- How can I serve people better and prove most helpful to our world and to the Church?
- > What is my real place in this world?
- ▶ What can I offer to society?
- > Do I have the abilities needed to offer this kind of service?
- Could I develop those abilities?

These questions should be centered less on ourselves and our own inclinations, but on others, so that our discernment leads us to see our life in relation to their lives.

- That is why I would remind you of the most important question of all. So often in life, we waste time asking ourselves: 'Who am I?'
- > You can keep asking, 'Who am I?' for the rest of your lives.

But the real question is: "For whom am I?"

Of course you are for God. But he has decided that you are also to be for others, and he has given you many qualities, inclinations, gifts, and charisms that are not for you, but to share with those around you. (Christ Is Alive 285-286)

BEING CONVERTED TO FRATERNITY/SOLIDARITY

In recent months I have often thought about the mission of the Church in the world, motivated by Pope Francis's message for the 47th World Day of Peace in 2018, titled *"Fraternity/Solidarity: Foundation and Pathway for Peace."*

In this time of ours, characterized by globalization, everyone can go anywhere, meet people of every race, people, nation, and religion, profit from products coming from every part of the world, and send products to any part of the world. Surprisingly, however, social tensions, walls and cultural, religious, ethnic and economic barriers multiply. Being part of the same human species does not seem to be an incentive to experience solidarity. Very often, taking care of one's own dog or cat feels like more of a duty and pleasure than caring for a poor person who lives or passes close to us.

The sense of a certain brotherhood or sisterhood is shared in the restricted circles of those who belong to one's own territory, who are close in culture, religion, nationality, or another sort of political belonging or association.

From these observations I asked myself what constitutes the foundation and the particular nature of the relationships proposed in the Gospel. I thought about what importance and role the proposal of evangelical fraternity has in the life of the Church and in its mission in discussion with the world.

The Gospel does not propose an elitist fraternity, but a universal one, as the pages of the Gospel suggest. There Jesus speaks of being "merciful like the Father," of "loving one's enemies," renouncing every violence. He identified himself with the poor, the suffering, the disinherited, and the "little ones" of every sort. Precisely in identifying himself with these "least and last ones," Jesus gives us a motivation for human solidarity that goes well beyond the rationale of belonging to the same human species or of equalizing rights or of the necessity for solidarity.

All these reasons, including race, culture, political belonging, religion, or other, have always allowed and likewise have justified deep inequality and egoism and even estrangement of one from another.

On the other hand, evangelical motivation encourages an alternative, radical solidarity because this links the practice of authentic brotherhood/sisterhood to one's relationship with the Lord, who is its foundation and at the same time demonstrates what it means.

In fact, we read in the First Letter of St. John, "We love because God first loved us. If anyone says, 'I love God,' but hates a brother or sister, that person is a liar; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen cannot love God, whom they have not seen. This is the commandment we have from God: whoever loves God must also love one's brother and sister" (4:19-21).

Therefore a solidarity that emerges from a triumph and victory over the cult of individualism, with its self-referential focus, its selfcontemplation and self-realization, is always a victory of the Gospel. Such attitudes are poles apart from solidarity and Gospel joy. This solidarity is counter-cultural.

A brotherhood/sisterhood that has not been imposed by law is accomplished through the daily practice of love of neighbor. It is a task freely assumed through the love of God the Father and of Jesus our brother, in union with the Holy Spirit. Experiences of brotherhood and sisterhood in the Church, while they bring about or would like to bring about evangelical solidarity, don't end inside a person, but are a way of acting toward each person that the Lord puts on one's path. Furthermore, they indicate to the world that such solidarity is possible, not as an ethical imperative or human energy, but as a gift of God, who is recognized and loved as the merciful Father who calls us and lets us be "merciful like the Father" toward our brothers and sisters.

Saint Angela strongly insisted to her daughters that they live as sisters. What a beautiful witness to give to the world!

A WORLDWIDE IDENTITY: KNOWING THE CULTURES OF OTHERS GLIMPSES OF "AMERICAN CULTURE"

Diversity: Gifts and Challenges of American Culture

The America of Hollywood movies does not exist. We are not all New York or Disneyland! Yet, as with any



stereotype, some element of truth underlies the caricature.

Our sisters in the USA have helped me to describe our culture. We live in different states. We have different ethnic identities. One is an immigrant. We manifest the diversity in our nation and our Church.



Diversity!

If one word can begin our story, it must be "diversity." As one sister observed, "Sometimes traveling within the US can be as strong a 'culture shock' as traveling abroad."

The land is vast. Regions have vastly different racial and ethnic groups, histories, even languages, though English prevails.

• Each feature of our national identity has an opposite, equally true. We will conclude by considering our role amid this variety, which is beautiful but also stressful and challenging.

Strength... Freedom... Individualism



We are the land of pioneers, who carved farms and cities out of wilderness indigenous (blind to the peoples they displaced). Families and civic communities maintain traditions based on that shared memory. We take great pride in individual accomplishment and

competition. Private property is seen as the result of individual effort. Hard work is a strong value. Self-sufficiency is an ideal. Strong individuals overcome daunting obstacles through determination and ingenuity.

Yet our prosperity has depended upon uncompensated labor: first of enslaved people kidnapped from Africa, then of exploited workers. Racism – our original sin – continues to curse our land.

"The land of the free..." was born in a revolution against colonialism, and **freedom** remains our dominant common value, often translated into independence. Teenagers leave their parents' homes and

elders remain in their own homes. We drive our own automobiles and cling to autonomy. **Individualism** marks almost every aspect of American life. It fosters great personal strength, though often neglecting the common good. Independence also underlies a masculine culture of violence and idolatry of guns.





Public expressions of **patriotism** are everywhere. Patriotism is often combined with respect for the military and for other uniformed services such as police and fire-fighters.

Wealth ... Generosity

We are the world's

wealthiest nation. Yet the wealth-gap widens. Individualism cripples public support for health care, education, and other human resources, as well as for infra-structure, all evaluated by a financial calculation:

"Does it put money into my pocket?" This criterion has no place for prayer or contemplation. Consumerism magnifies many desires into perceived needs. That includes highly sexualized а environment, especially affecting youth.

Americans

are



generous. The first circle of generosity is one's own family and friends, especially when they suffer a crisis or a need. Going further, we value **volunteerism** very highly. Through volunteer activities Americans reach a wider circle, extending themselves in service to others outside the family: serving in a food pantry, recycling, caring for the environment, promoting the arts, assisting in education or health care... Schools foster the value of volunteer service in our youth. We also value financial support for charitable enterprises that reach an expansive circle of strangers in need: "the enormous outpouring of generosity, love, and concern in the wake of natural disasters, like hurricanes or tornadoes."

Immigrants... Enrichment... Polarization



We are the land of **immigrants** – thus our huge ethnic variety... cuisines, arts, intellectual traditions. Families take pride in these legacies from every corner of the world. Intermarriage brings these riches together in new families and creates new ethnic and racial blends. Immigrant communities foster a solidarity that could be a model to the rest of us, while public education and social mingling help us overcome divisions.

But how can some Americans be so unwelcoming to new arrivals? One of our members, an immigrant, describes the

country as "like a person who is cold and puts on many layers of clothing. It is difficult to see his real face, to make friends, because he cannot open his hands. He needs to preserve the heat that he has."

The present migration into our southern border illustrates our competing values. Government responds with walls and soldiers. Volunteers care for the stranger.

Political and economic differences **polarize** us and test the fabric of our national identity. Traditional... progressive... individualist... communal... All have elements of goodness. All need the balance of another perspective. Yet polarization makes dialogue, balance, and mutual learning almost impossible.

Religious Presence

We are a religious people, mostly Protestant Christians, but increasingly diverse as more Asian and African immigrants arrive. Communities of faith are islands in a schizophrenic culture: secular but requiring public demonstrations of religion. Our members describe their families as rooted in Christ, Christian faith, and personal dignity.

American Catholicism blends diverse ethnicities, languages, cultures, economic classes.... Our network of education and healthcare is unparalleled. Our commitment to the dignity of pre-born children is

well known. But the Church too suffers polarization on religious and civil issues. The sister who described the "cold man" above finds the Church similarly unwelcoming to newcomers.

The Company in the USA Culture



The Company is new here, less than twenty years old. What must we, as a Company, understand in order to be at home – incultured? St. Angela has given us the essentials and allows us to grow in

different soils, yes in American soil.

First, we must accept and respect diversity, among ourselves

and in our wider culture. We are not required to adopt all the beliefs and practices swirling around us. St. Angela guides us: "Consider each one as good, but be prudent for your own good."



Second, we must, as Pope Francis says, "**build bridges, not walls**." Respectful listening, mutual understanding, and collaboration for the common good are better than winning an argument or making someone change. Rather, we can be present to others' problems and joys and pray for them. Rather than proselytize, we seek to bear witness to our own faith, by word or by deed.

Third, in Church, society and Company, let us seek our **deepest** shared values. If we find our true unity there, our differences will not divide. In the Company, our deepest shared values flow from the Gospel and from our consecration.



Women belonging to Christ, daughters of St. Angela, sisters to the worldwide Company, our Group of the USA feels called to **offer the Gospel by** ...

- Making it known.
- Being a living witness of the Gospel.
- Being a Gospel presence in family and Church.
- Living contemplatively within the secular world.
- Trying to be patient and kind, even amid stress and chaos.
- Loving and welcoming the stranger and the person who is

different from me.

- Promoting justice.
- Advocating for protection of all life and human dignity from conception to natural death, including criminals, prisoners of conscience, non-Christians, non-Americans, LGBT people, warfare, etc.
- Being an example of *agape* love in a 'me-and-my-people-first' culture, treating all with equal respect and dignity.
- Raising up in the Church a Gospel attentiveness to newcomers.

The Company that finds its unity in the Gospel can be truly American: both embracing and challenging our nation.

Thomas was six vears old when he got close to the bishop who was visiting his campo. He showed the bishop his hand, which was missing two fingers. In a trembling voice he asked, "Please. can vou heal me?"

The bishop took his hand and held it affectionately, without saying a word....

One day a woman arrived in my office, her eves full of tears, and asked me to help her because her daughter had been kidnapped....

These episodes make us feel powerless in situations to which no one could give a concrete answer, except to entrust everything to the Lord in prayer.

We consecrated seculars are called to live in our polis with two dimensions:

• **first as women of praver**, able to immerse each action in praver, since without this strength, without this special resource, we are simply women who perform different de manding professions:

• second as spouses of the Savior: "to be spouses of the Son of God." A call to be for him, the most beautiful among the sons of men.

But often we are absorbed by daily happenings and we forget him.

We are called to be mystics, daughters of a mystical innovator, to be like St. Angela Merici.

Many think that mystics live outside reality.

Instead, the great mystics were very active people: we think of St. Gertrude, St. Teresa of Avila, St. Catherine of Siena. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Chiara Lubich, Edith Stein, Hetty Hillesum, Madeleine Delbrel, Marie of the Incarnation...

We are all called to this experience of mystical union with God. according to the Catechism of the universal Church (n. 2014): *Spiritual progress tends toward ever more intimate union with Christ.... God calls us all to this intimate union with him.*

One day I read that Buddhism takes people to live as mystics with their eves closed, while we Christians are called to be "mystics with eves open." according to the definition of Johannes Baptists Metz, the founder of political theology.

But what kind of mysticism are we talking about?

About mysticism of the heart, with one's gaze always turned to the Lord, but also about mysticism of justice and truth among others....

We make of our hearts a cradle, so that all may be welcome, especially those crucified in our present history...

It is not enough to stop and look. Rather, it is necessary to sit next to them, to give time to listen... to share their journey, their suffering.

The mystic seeks the face of Jesus and grows in her ability to enlarge her horizons, and the space of her tent: "*enlarge the space of your tents, stretch out your tent cloths unsparingly, lengthen your ropes, make strong your pegs*..." (Isaiah 54:2-4).

We daughters of Angela Merici are called in a particular way to follow the Madre's path and thus, each in her own environment, will seek and find the way to live in fidelity to the Merician charism.

On My Road, Full of Joy...

From my youth, when I was around twelve years old, I cultivated in my heart the desire to consecrate myself to

the Lord.

But then for a long time I had to abandon this thought, because Burundi underwent an oppressive war. Therefore I was not able to continue my schooling, which would have been necessary to join an instituted of consecrated life.

At the age of fourteen, having been confirmed, I still did not know if there would be a congregation that could accept me without a diploma.

In 1998, in the parish at Gitongo, I met Father Giovani Bosco Wakana, who told me that there were young women in the diocese who wanted to consecrate themselves to God in the world: the *Bene Angela*. With the help of the Holy Spirit, Father Giovani Bosco had already gathered many young women with the intention of consecrating themselves in the world, and he had prepared an adequate formation for them.

was not among the first *Bene Angela* of our parish to begin this journey, because I still did not understand well, but bit by bit I understood what this secular consecration meant. My cousin Maria explained to me what consecration in the world involved, so that I too felt the desire to accept this calling.

The first *Bene Angela* encountered many difficulties, because their experience appeared so different from every other form of consecrated life in Burundi. People thought that perhaps it was for strange, eccentric people...

Some of their parents did not understand their vocation. In my case, all these persecutions strengthened my desire to consecrate myself in this form of life; according to me, it was a holy persecution.



In March 2000, I asked to be accepted among the *Bene Angela*. I was accepted and began formation and was suddenly very content, because from that moment I felt that I had found myself on the road that was right for me.

I began to attend their spiritual exercises in 2003. In 2004 the formation guide asked me to study to learn how to read and write. I was happy and asked permission from my parents to go to school, which they permitted.

Satisfied by the road I had undertaken, I desired to go forward without turning back....

For a while I lived in the little house of the *Bene Angela* at Nyabibuye, because my school was nearby, though far from my parents' house. Therefore I thank Natalia, our leader, and her council for having offered me this opportunity.

When the Council of the Federation gave us the Constitutions of the Institute, we reviewed and restarted our formation, according to this charism and spirituality.

It was not immediately easy to understand and study, but slowly I began to understand and asked to make my first consecration in the Company of St. Ursula, Secular Institute of Saint Angela Merici. Finally, on November 27, 2016, I made my first Consecration.

I realized that I was on my road, full of joy, able to persevere freely on the road I had undertaken. I renewed my consecration on August 26, 2018, to continue in the charism and in a mission together with the sisters of the whole world.



We also felt an urgency to offer to all the Companies and Groups of the Federation guidelines for study on the theme "Called through faith."

Presence, Closeness, Tenderness...

The annual days of spirituality for the members of the Council of the Federation are an important time for sharing.

At this meeting, as whenever a Company or Group of sisters gather, our holy Madre Angela's words are quite suitable: "You must take care to have your daughters come together ... like this, they might also meet each other as loving sisters, and thus, talking over spiritual matters, rejoice together, and together encourage one another" (8th Leg. 1-5).

Above all we are sisters who get together to reinforce our unity with "bonds of charity," to know one another and to function as a united body, like a "*mighty fortress, or a tower impregnable*" (Last Counsel 2-15).



Unity spreads out, as to concentric circles, and the unity that is created among the Council members certainly spreads to the Companies we care for.

If then these days helped us update ourselves

together, attentive to the path of our Church, then the final result is surely God's grace.

This year our days were dedicated to "reading together," (which is never the same as "reading individually") the final document of the Synod of Bishops, "*Youth, Faith, and Vocational Discernment.*"

Guided through the letter, accompanied in this study by our Assistant Bishop Adriano, and urged by him to reflect, we were drawn to understand the depth of several passages, those that the limited time required us to identify as "important" passages ... but all is important and must be completed attentively.

Knowing the document also had the goal of orienting us, giving substance to the content of our next international convention, which will take place in July at Mascalucia, in beautiful Sicily.

To make my testimony a little bit concrete, I will say that among the notable passages that struck me was the chapter about accompaniment.

In n. 91 it says, "Accompaniment for the sake of valid, stable and wellfounded choices, is therefore a service that is widely needed. Being present, supporting and accompanying the journey towards authentic choices is one way for the Church to exercise her maternal function, giving birth to the freedom of the children of God. Service of this kind is simply the continuation of the way in which the God of Jesus Christ acts towards his people: through constant and heartfelt presence, dedicated and loving closeness and tenderness without limits."

Certainly, we will not all be called to do formation work personally, as understood here, but we are called to orient our hearts to the "constant and heartfelt presence, dedicated and loving closeness and tenderness without limits" ... we are all called to this.

Because it is "The community as a whole that is the prime subject of accompaniment, precisely because in its heart it develops that drama of relationships that can support the person on his journey and furnish him with points of reference and orientation" (Doc. finale n.° 92).

It should never be forgotten that ... "In the assembly gathered for the Eucharistic celebration, the experience of being personally touched, instructed and healed by Jesus accompanies each person on his or her journey of personal growth." (Final doc. n.° 92). And to avoid the temptation of taking refuge in the "comfortable" thought that all this writing is addressed **exclusively** to the specialists (parents, educators, catechists ... priests, religious, and specially designated lay people...), let us remember that "All the different vocations come together in the one universal call to holiness, which can only be the fulfilment of the appeal to the joy of love that resounds in the heart of every young person (Final doc 165) and of all of us.

"God wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence" (Francis, Rejoice and Be Glad, n. 1).

Christ is alive. He is our hope and the most beautiful youthfulness of this world. He is in you, He is with you and will never depart. No matter how you can distance yourself, the Risen One is next to you, calls you, and waits for you to start again. When sadness, rancor, fears, doubts, or failures make you feel old, He will be there to restore your strength and hope. (Christ Lives)



Convention of Leaders Brescia, April 24-27

"The courage for personal and community discernment on a journey of fidelity": This was the theme of the days of spirituality oriented for directresses, for all the leaders of the Companies and of the Federation.

It is always wonderful to be together

for prayer, reflection, and a time of sisterhood. Again this year I had the opportunity to experience this occasion, which has by now become a standard appointment.

The days were introduced by Valeria Broll, president of the Federation, who stressed the beauty of belonging to the same family. Saint Angela encouraged us to nourish great longings and to have a strong will.

Dr. Claudia Ciotti, a psychotherapist, emphasized the importance of discernment, a constitutive element of the life of every believer and of the Church.

In her first talk she presented the necessity of communitarian discernment. It is not possible to be synodal without a style of discernment. It is not possible to experience communitarian discernment if we do not learn to walk together.

Such an intention makes it necessary to understand the viewpoints of others, thereby to foster co-responsibility within the

community. The more one is faithful to personal discernment in one's personal life, the more one can contribute to communitarian discernment.





The second talk put forth the value of personal discernment for the purpose of making decisions in the light of God's Word.

Dr. Ciotti referred to the author Rupnik, who affirms that discernment is the art of recognizing Christ and of recognizing him as our Lord and Savior.

There were also times for conversation, prayer, and sisterhood. During the Eucharistic celebration on April 25, we received the newly reprinted Italian edition of the Constitutions of 1994, with the additions

made in 2000 and 2018.

We entrusted the journeys of the Companies and of every single sister to the intercession of Saint Angela.

On the morning of April 27, the President of the Federation read and commented on the additions to the Constitutions made in 2000 and 2018, proposing to all the Companies that they make a careful evaluation of their own reality, so as to arrive at responsible decisions and changes that are necessary and can no longer be postponed.

Trusting in the help of the Lover of us all, let us travel the roads of the world faithfully and joyfully.

Thanks are owed to the Federation, which for so many years has

organized these days of spirituality and, in these last three years, this psychological course of formation. It has been a valuable opportunity to reflect on one's personal journey and on that of the community.

Remembrance of Bishop Olmi



Many times we have met Bishop Olmi, Father Superior of Company the of Brescia. and we participated in his funeral, right on the death-anniversary of Saint Angela Merici, co-patron of the

Diocese of Brescia.

Bishop Olmi's funeral ceremonies were a celebration of thanksgiving and appreciation for his life and his ministry. He was totally dedicated to his diocese and to the spread of the Merician charism.

We were all grateful for his great love for and such long service to the Merician institutes.

Now may Saint Angela, who *sees better and knows more* the good we do, continue to intercede with God and obtain for us the grace of fidelity and perseverance in this beautiful vocation as consecrated seculars.

We would like to report some passages from Bishop Pierantonio Tremolada's homily at the funeral of Bishop Vigilio Mario Olmi:

"None of us would have ever imagined that we would celebrate the funeral of Bishop Vigilio Mario on this feast day, the feast of Saint Angela Merici, co-patron of the Diocese of Brescia. No one would ever have thought that it would be possible on this occasion to vest for a funeral liturgy in the white vestments of this solemnity.

"But this is what is happening. We are saluting our beloved brother bishop while recalling with all our people the great figure of Saint Angela, so dear to this city. The Lord who guides history with loving providence never ceases to surprise us. What may appear to us as simple, though fortunate, coincidences are truly much more: they are circumstances that correspond to his designs of grace, signs of his sweet benevolence.

"Bishop Vigilio Mario had an entirely particular devotion to Saint Angela Merici, very lively and deep. He was firmly convinced of her singular charism and was most happy to be able to recognize and venerate her as co-patron of Brescia, together with Saints Faustino and Giovita...

"It seems apt to me, as we accompany Bishop Vigilio Mario to his encounter with the Lord, to look at his life and his apostolic ministry in the light of Saint Angela, her charism and her witness...

"Saint Angela, spouse of Christ, opened her heart to the voice of the One who called her to a life of total consecration, and she let herself be conquered by Him. From there, the creative power of the Holy Spirit led her to imagine a completely new form of service to the neighbor, a style of life according to the Gospel that gave to her consecration the form of loving closeness to people in her own land, among the homes, schools, and hospitals in order to accompany, assist, support, and console. An attentive and affectionate company... attention to a life dedicated by charity and constantly vitalized by prayer. This is the secret of the spirituality of Saint Angela Merci.

"The voice of Christ the Spouse spoke also to the heart of Bishop Vigilio Mario. His was a call that reached him in the course of his interior life, beginning with his Baptism, and which made of him first a priest and then a bishop of this Brescian Church, to which he dedicated his entire existence...

"He loved the priests very much. He knew them very well. Thanks to an exceptional memory, which helped him until the last moments of his life, he recalled precisely all the pathways he had taken to that destination. An eloquent sign of his affection was his habit of telephoning birthday greetings, which every Brescian priest knew he would receive on the morning of his birthday, but also his desire to participate in the funeral vigils for deceased priests, in which he retraced each one's life-journey.

"His discrete and faithful presence was profoundly respectful and attentive. He remained clear till the end and spoke frankly when he thought that *"His energies abated progressively with the passage of time. His temperament, however, was tenacious.*

"An auxiliary bishop is, by definition, a bishop who helps, who is at hand to serve the one who has the ultimate responsibility of guiding a diocesan Church. This is how Bishop Vigilio Maria lived out his vocation, with a humble authority and generous steadiness, benefitting the Church whose son he was, and which he loved with his whole self. May the Lord reword him for it.

"May God reward him as only He knows how. And may God help us gather the fruit of his precious legacy of witness."

Company of Brazil Southeast



Our Company is in the southern part of Brazil.

It was begun by Nicole Jeandot, an Angeline missionary, French by origin.

The beginnings of the Company were very difficult. For some years various candidates entered the Institute

but then did not persevere.

Finally, by God's grace, two sisters consecrated themselves at São Paolo and, one by one, the Company grew in number.

In the state of Bahia, in the northeastern part of Brazil, a group started and quickly became more numerous, so much so that Nicole thought it would be best to start a new Company.

This is how there came to be two Companies in Brazil: Southeast and Northeast. This developed also on account of the great distance between the two territories.

In the Southeast we are now in six small groups: 1 group in the State of Rio de Janeiro, 1 group in the State of São Paolo and 4 groups in the State of Rio Grande do Sul.

I belong to the group of **Rio de Janeiro**. There are three of us: I and Maria Helena are consecrated, and Donna Ilda, a widow, is in initial formation.



In the group of **São Paolo** there are also three: two consecrated for life, and one in temporary consecration.



The area of **Rio Grande do Sul** is subdivided into four is groups. One in Novo Hamburgo with three consecrated for life. A group at Boa Saúde has one consecrated for life and two in temporary consecration. Another group is found at Porto Alegre, with one consecrated for life and five in initial formation. The fourth

group is at Sarandi and has four in initial formation.

The Vice-directress Maria Gatelli is in charge of formation for the sisters of Rio Grande do Sul. Nivalda, a councilor, leads formation for the group of São Paolo, and I do so for the group of Rio de Janiero.

Normally we meet monthly for formation and use the formation

journal "Liame" (= links), begun by Nicole. Now Edésia, the formator for the Northeast Company, is the one who writes it, giving it continuity.

We also always study the Rule, the Constitutions, "In the same charism," and Kate's book *A Path of Holiness*.

We heartily thank the Federation and all those sisters who work with such great effort for our formation.

We truly have excellent assistance at the level of formation and discernment.



Our Institute is very well organized, united, and strong from a spiritual point of view.

On May 25, 2018, the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) took effect, that is, the European regulation n. 670 of 2016 regarding treatment, circulation, and protection of personal data. It involves a European Union law and, as such, is directly applicable and does not need to be adopted by any norms at the national level.
